focusing on educational achievement, wellbeing and engagement, and culture and inclusion.

Mackay North State High School implements the requirements of the P-12 Framework considering government priorities and in consultation with parents and the school community. Our requirements are met through effective school leadership, quality teaching and learning, focusing on improved systematic curriculum delivery, to ensure all students, of all identities and abilities are able to:

- access and participate in the curriculum alongside their similar-aged peers
- achieve academically and socially with tailored supports including reasonable adjustments that meet their learning needs.

Our school utilises 3 high impact teaching strategies as identified in contemporary research and endorsed by the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership. The three strategies with a high effect size are

- Explicit Instruction,
- Learning Intentions and
- Feedback.

Different KLAs are exploring subject based pedagogies to best focus on their curriculum and delivery.

Our pedagogy is represented by a placemat that outlines our consideration of the Equity and Excellence policy, our AIP and the AITSL teacher capabilities. The evidence base for our pedagogy is best represented in the work of Hattie and Timperley (2006) particularly around the effect size of high impact strategies and feedback.

Whilst these educational theories identify overarching pedagogical approaches, each unit of work identifies targeted pedagogical approaches adopted to suit the specific unit of work and subject.

Mackay North SHS ensures inclusion through:

- Provision of reasonable adjustments and support tailored to meet individual learning needs, allowing the opportunity for achievement academically, culturally and socially.
- Creation of a welcoming environment within and beyond the classroom.
- Ensuring access and participation in high-quality education and full engagement in the curriculum alongside their similar-aged peers
- Provision of a safe and supportive environment, addressing bullying, discrimination or harassment.
