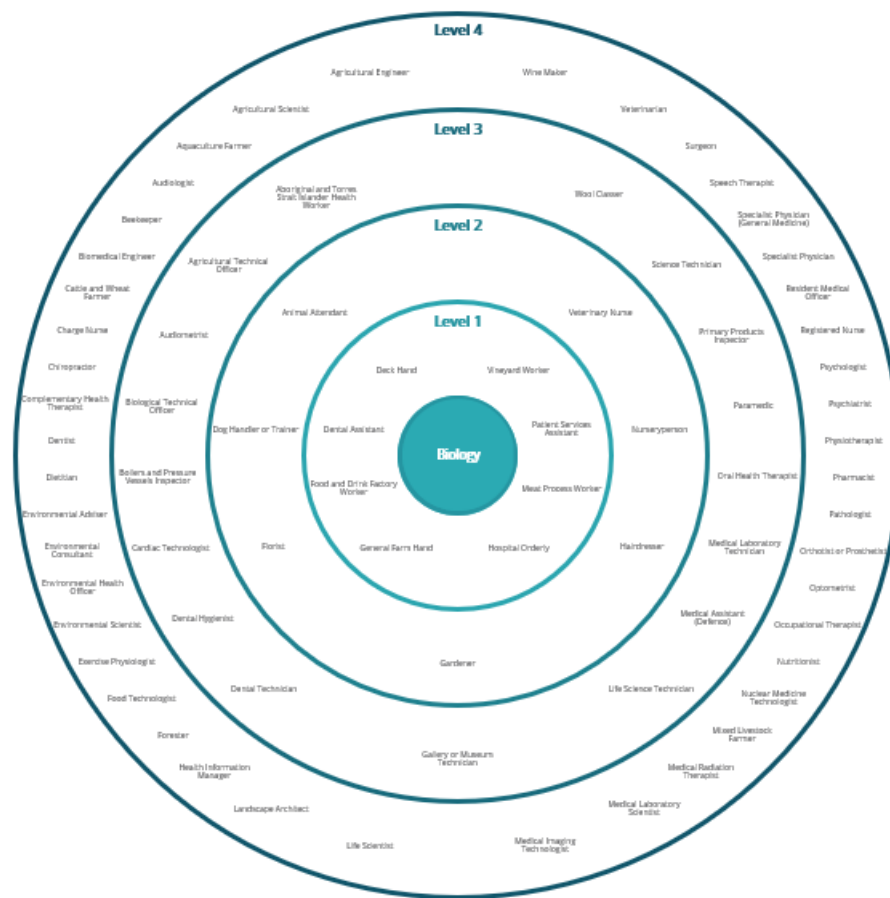


## Challenge Question Answers

### 1. Any 3 from the Biology Bullseye

If you enjoy or are good at this learning area, explore the occupations below.



Anything which explains that level 4 is a higher level of training:

### Training Levels and Requirements

**Level 1:**  
Usually has a skill level equal to the completion of Year 10, a Senior Secondary Certificate of Education, Certificate II or II. Australian Apprenticeships may be offered at this level.

**Level 2:**  
Usually has a skill level equal to a Certificate III or IV, or at least three years relevant experience. Australian Apprenticeships may be offered at this level.

**Level 3:**  
Usually requires a level of skill equal to a Diploma or Advanced Diploma. Study is often undertaken through TAFEs or Registered Training Organisations. Some universities offer studies at this level.

**Level 4:**  
Usually requires a level of skill equal to a Bachelor Degree or higher qualification. Study is often undertaken at a university.

**Information:**  
This chart shows a selection of occupations that have some relation to the learning area you have selected.

The four education and training levels are to be used as a guide only. These levels indicate the most common education and/or entry requirements for these jobs.

The title of an occupation viewed may differ to the title of the occupation selected. This is a result of a new data source for occupational information.

### 3 Any 3 of these:

- accompanying aged and disabled persons during daily activities
- assisting clients with their mobility
- preparing food for clients
- arranging social activities
- performing housekeeping tasks such as vacuuming and cleaning
- assisting in personal hygiene and dressing

- providing companionship, friendship and emotional support
- may do shopping and run errands
- may live in with the person.

- 4      Level 4 occupations in the construction field: Professional Builder, Naval Architect, Mechanical Engineer, Landscape Architect, Interior Designer, Engineering Technologist, Civil Engineer, Building and Construction Manager, Architect, Urban and Regional Planner, Surveyor, Quantity Surveyor.

Level 4 occupations usually require a Bachelor's Degree or higher.

- 5      To be a Nurse Manager, you would need a Bachelor Degree or higher

A Nurse Manager would work an average of 36.5 hours per week

- 6      Diesel Fitter Occupations: Metal fitter and machinist, motor vehicle parts and accessories fitter, motor mechanics, defence force members (other ranks), automotive electricians, aircraft maintenance engineers, technicians and trade workers, electricians, crane, hoist and life operators etc

- 7      The average number of hours worked by a Metal Fitter or Machinist is 42.1
